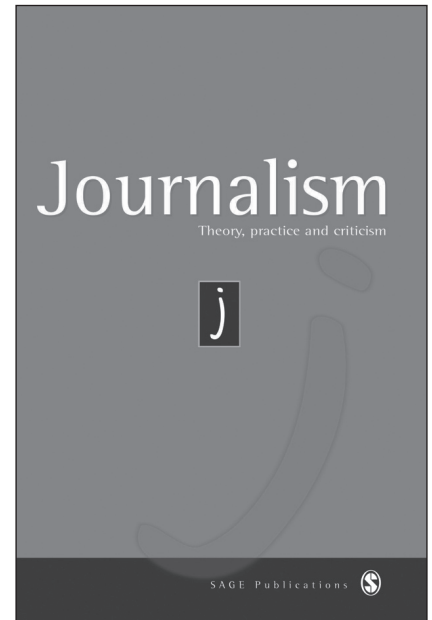
Journalism is a major international and interdisciplinary journal that provides a dedicated forum for articles from the growing community of academic researchers and critical practitioners with an interest in journalism.
